



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Ruling affects teachers

The state's highest court has ruled that a letter giving a teacher bad grades for conduct or performance can be placed in the teacher's file without a hearing.

By a wide majority, the Court of Appeals upheld a statute of the state Education Law on Thursday which allows the placing of such critical letters, if they are written by a tenured teacher or school administrator, in teachers' personnel files.

The ruling affects some 250,000 public school teachers in the state.

The decision involved two teachers in Cattaraugus and Dutchess counties who claimed they should be have had
